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
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Geanie Vaughan Reaches 500-Spike Achievement

The HomeFront -Gov't Affairs News and Info

A Busy Spring for Government Affairs

Spring time in Texas. The frost thaws, the winds roar, the storms rage and it all gets greener. And that's just the primary elections.

The Lone Star State's second Super Tuesday, while only answering half the equation, still gave a forecast of what future leadership may look like in Austin. And while May 27 got all the attention of news outlets, it was just one of many items garnishing the focus of the Dallas Builders Association.

In Ellis County, John Wray's primary win for Texas House District 10 added to a list of HOMEPAC of Greater Dallas supported candidates who have found victory this spring. During the May 10 municipal elections, Rachel Huber won the approval of Ovilla voters, while Association Past President Joe Chamberlain earned a city council seat in Heath. He joins another Association member, David Hill, who is a new councilman in Waxahachie.

The primary run-off was the third election of this busy voting year. Key decisions remain as the general election on Nov. 4 not only brings the decision for Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General and a whole slew of statewide, state legislative and county offices, but also decisions for a U.S. Senate seat and all U.S. House seats. Additionally, voters will decide on a key constitutional amendment needed to bring more funding for needed roadway improvements.

In the Town of Flower Mound, Association advocacy that began well over a year ago, during the process that recommends regional amendments for the purpose of making recent I-Codes both workable and more affordable for the North Texas area, yielded another benefit for home builders. The Council voted to adopt the 2012 IRC and IECC codes with the regionally preferred COG amendments. In Allen, the Association advocated for and received an extended grace period for our builders, as the city's policy change that requires water heaters installed in attics to be tankless will now have a later effective date of Aug. 1.

The Dallas Builders Association is active on two statewide TAB task forces. A Water Task Force was recently created that will monitor the implementation of HB4 and State Water Implementation Fund for Texas (SWIFT) funding as it moves forward. As the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) now moves to implement SWIFT's low interest financing, each of TWDB's 16 regions must prepare final submittal of their 2011 water plan and list their region's projects for priority consideration. The Dallas BA, representing members of the TAB Water Task Force, will remain engaged in our own Region C's


process on the 2011 plan, as well as the soon to be drafted 2016 plan. In May, the Dallas Builders Association and the Greater Fort Worth Builders Association offered joint comments in support of a key Region C resource strategy, the Marvin Nichols reservoir.

With the increasing stringency of energy codes bringing serious ramifications for the home building industry. The TAB Codes and Standards Committee created the Energy Codes Task Force to discuss rational solutions for possible recommendation to the Codes and Standards Committee and, ultimately, to the TAB Government Relations Committee. Dallas BA is heavily involved in this discussion.

The value of Association membership is stretching all the way to Washington, D.C., as the debate on Housing Finance Reform continues. The Senate Committee on Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs voted to report the Johnson-Crap bill to the floor in May. The legislation builds off the Housing Finance Reform and Taxpayer Protection Act of 2013, S 1217, introduced by Senators Corker and Warner. Johnson-Crapo would help retain the 30-year mortgage and includes a significant buffer to avoid bailouts. Under the plan, Government Sponsored Enterprises would be dissolved over five years and replaced by a Federal Mortgage Insurance Corporation (FMIC). The FMIC would only guarantee losses in excess of 10 percent, requiring private investors to be accountable for losses well beyond those observed during the 2008 financial crisis. This would presumably lead to more cautious lending to risky borrowers than what had been seen before the financial crisis. It is up to the Senate Majority Leader to allow the legislation to move forward to a full Senate vote. NAHB is urging full Senate support. Dallas BA has continued to take advantage of opportunities to visit with North Texas Congressional members and advocate for responsible financial reforms.

These are just some of the items on the Association's advocacy agenda. As we move forward it will be important to remain engaged and offer to be an informational resource for elected officials as they take on decisions that affect the industry.

So as Summer begins, fire up the grill, turn up the Strait tunes and catch your breath by the pool. But don't get too comfortable. The general elections, more local government actions and the next legislative session will be here before we know it.

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
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
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
