

Jackel family moves into new home!

Wounded American hero Sgt. Stephen Jackel and his family have moved in to their new home built by Dallas BA Past President Tim Jackson Custom Homes. A dedication ceremony was held Saturday, May 31, at the 6-bedroom home in Little Elm, complete with crowds of well-wishers, a parade and television news crews. This Operation Finally Home project was made possible through contributions of many Dallas BA members, including the lot from Dale Clark, Warren Clark Development.

Sgt. Jackel served multiple tours in Iraq and Afghanistan. His long list of service awards includes a Purple Heart, an ARCOM-4 Award for Valor and an Afghanistan Campaign Medal with two Bronze Stars, among others.

In August 2011, while performing convoy security duties in Afghanistan, an IED exploded under the vehicle he occupied with his team. After the blast, Sgt. Jackel saved the lives of his team members by helping get them out of the vehicle and physically put out a fire inside the vehicle with his own leg. He sustained injuries resulting in required bilateral leg amputations as well as a traumatic brain injury.

"It was an honor to provide a home for this brave young man and his family," said Jackson. "It means so much to be able to give something back to this local hero in appreciation for his service and sacrifice to our country."

"For us to not ever have a concern like buying a house for the rest of our life, we don't have to worry about getting a home, we're in ours," says Sgt. Jackel. "Man, I love America." CBS's video of Jackel's reaction upon walking into his new home for the first time can be found on DallasBuilders. com under the "Giving Back" tab.

Operation Finally Home is the official charity of the Dallas Builders Association. The organizatin has been building mortgage-free homes for combat wounded veterans for almost nine years and has provided more than 130 homes for military families in 28 states. The Dallas BA's second project in Cedar Hill is expected to be completed this summer.

Dallas Considering Mandatory Work Breaks for Construction

On June 23, an ill conceived ordinance concept that has caused problems in Austin's construction industry received a hearing at Dallas City Hall. During the city's Quality of Life Committee meeting, Workers Defense Project (WDP), an organization with deep ties to union efforts, requested that city council members implement a rest break ordinance for construction workers. This unneeded ordinance is for the purpose of letting workers drink water and avoid heat-related injuries, which construction supervisors already allow and encourage.

While advertised as entitling an employee performing construction activity at a construction site a rest break of not less than 10 minutes for every four hours worked, the ordinance as pushed by WDP would state that no employee may be required to work more than 3.5 hours without a rest break. A sign describing the requirements would be required to be displayed at every construction site in English and Spanish. A violation of this ordinance could result in a criminal penalty, if enacted in a manner such as Austin's code. In Austin, a person commits a Class C misdemeanor if the person fails to provide a work break; or fails to post the required signage. And the resulting fines can run from \$100 to \$500 each day the violation occurs. These penalties can extend to the general contractor even if the violation is committed by a subcontractor.

An ordinance like the one proposed for Austin, and now being pushed on Dallas, not only confuses the liability issue, it also seems to ignore the operational differences seen in the construction industry. Unlike manufacturing activity on an assembly line, construction is a very fluid process where work activity varies daily and widely. Workers shift from performing manual tasks to waiting for materials to doing paperwork or monitoring safety hazards such as an open manhole. There are many scenarios where rigid mandatory breaks would increase job site injuries and decrease safety of the structures being built. OSHA, who is charged with setting and enforcing workplace safety standards, recommends maximum flexibility when it comes to managing heat stress as opposed to rigid mandatory breaks.

After enacting the ordinance in Austin, the city's Construction Advisory Committee (CAC) had to revisit the ordinance and recommend changes in

how an alleged violation was investigated. A protocol including minimum elements, such as interviewing other workers on the site and documentation of worker testimony, were apparently not clearly defined for enforcement. Even worse, when the question of enforcement arose, WDP pushed to allow workers to make blanket anonymous and/or confidential complaints. In a memorandum circulated in 2013 by a member of Austin's CAC, the member pointed to the problematic scenario where a person could have been liable for criminal and/or civil penalties and possibly face legal action in municipal court with no information as to who the accuser is, no information as to the specific basis of the complaint and no opportunity to cross-examine the accuser concerning the allegations.

In their presentation to the Dallas City Council, the WDP omitted important data that shows Texas' improvement in worker safety. Data from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, analysis from the Associated General Contractors of America shows that the construction fatality rate in Texas has declined faster than most other states. From 2008 to 2011, it declined 26 percent, giving Texas the eighth largest drop compared to the 41 states and the District of Columbia where fatality rates are tracked. Contractors in the Lone Star State have also been very successful in reducing the construction injury rate by 36 percent over the last 10 years.

The Association cannot think of any contractor or home builder who would willfully deprive workers of water and rest. Such practices are counterproductive and inhumane. Improvements to worker safety must continue to be a priority for our industry. However, ordinances such as the one proposed by WPD are problematic and unneeded. If Dallas is to remain open for business, it must look at all the data and objectively determine if there is a need for this ordinance. The evidence proves there is not.

This proposal is a strong reminder of why it is important be a part of the Dallas Builders Association. We are on the front lines for you, our members, when costly and unnecessary regulation is introduced.
