Bill Slease posthumously awarded Hugh Prather Trophy during Oct. 2 Installation

The Dallas Builders Association awarded the 2015 Hugh Prather Trophy posthumously to William "Bill" Swope Slease, who lost his battle with cancer in March. The award is the highest honor bestowed by the Dallas BA and has been presented annually for the past 65 years to a builder, remodeler or developer member who has done the most for the betterment of the North Texas region.

The 2015 presentation was made during the Association's Oct. 2 Installation of Leadership held at the Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Garden and presented by Johnson Supply and Struc-Sure Home Warranty.

The award was named for the Association's first president, Hugh Prather, in hopes that his principles would serve as a guide for future generations of builders. It is not meant to be simply a "Builder of the Year," but something more that reflects credit to the building industry.

Past recipients include homebuilding icons such as Dave Fox, W.W. Caruth Jr., Bob Folsom, Fred Roach, Kent Conine, Tommy Ford, N.D. Hopkins and Harold Pollman, among others.

2014 Prather recipient Tim Jackson of Tim Jackson Custom Homes presented the award to Slease's widow, Judy Slease, noting that "Bill's passion and enthusiasm for home building and remodeling could be heard and felt in his deep booming voice that echoed through our conference room as he readily shared his immense knowledge with others."

Slease was an Honored Life Direc-

tor and had also served on the Texas Association of Builder board. He was selected by the National Association of Home Builders as CAPS Builder of the Year and was a frequent instructor for the Dallas BA's Certified Aging-in-Place Specialist classes.

He was considered a pioneer in the field of whole house Universal Design and was one of the first to incorporate this approach into new construction and remodeling projects.

An active member of Northwest Bible Church for more than 35 years, Bill's vision was the seed for many discipleship groups at the church and community groups. Most recently, he served as treasurer to Apostrophe Mission Foundation, an outreach to China.

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Already an Active Autumn for Advocacy

In what continues to be a busy year for advocacy, September brought resolution on a months-long advocacy effort and an opportunity for outreach to both elected officials and the general public.

On the local front, the Prosper Town Council approved changes to various residential development standards contained within the town's zoning ordinance on Sept. 22. Thanks to industry advocacy by the Dallas Builders Association, the Prosper Developers Council and their combined members, changes to the proposed amendments save builders thousands of dollars in construction cost increases. The industry effort also assures that consumers still have their choice of a variety of products that are in demand in the marketplace.

As originally proposed, the amendments included significant and costly design requirements including that garage doors be located a minimum of 5 feet behind the facade of the house, an extremely costly mandate for enhanced paving treatments for driveways, onerous requirements for corner lots, and interior fencing and a garage square footage increase that would greatly impact floor plans. Throughout the process, members of the Town Council and the Planning and Zoning Commission made themselves available for discussion on the matter and took input from stakeholders.

An effective advocacy effort resulted in changes to heavy-hitting amendments such as a smaller increase in garage square footage, reduction in the amount of trees required for side yards on corner lots, and that interior fences not facing the street do not have to be constructed of boardon-board. The driveway and corner lot fencing requirements were removed from the package. Other design standards including use of masonry products, with option of the council to approve alternative materials, and anti-monotony requirements were approved.

The ordinance amendments will be effective near the middle of October of 2015. Dallas BA will remain in contact with officials in Prosper in order to make further information, including the ordinance language, available to members in the near future. Members should also be aware that Prosper is planning to address possible changes to its subdivision ordinance as well.

The Association benefited from a recent outreach opportunity provided by one of our area's State Senators. In late September, Dallas BA's David Lehde and TAB's Ned Munoz participated on a panel regarding municipal regulatory authority during a Town Hall hosted by Senator Don Huffines.

Dallas BA spoke on the benefits and flexibility provided by the authority the state gives local governments to govern on local issues, citing the needs cities often have and problems they can solve through local control. The Association also talked about the importance of the limitations the state places on that authority and how those limitations protect property rights.

they advocated to state legislators. Three propositions that will be on the Nov. 3 constitutional ballot are priority votes for our industry.

Proposition 1 will lower property taxes and ban real estate transfer taxes. Proposition 2 allows all surviving spouses of 100% disabled veterans to receive a homestead exemption. And in the effort to help with Texas' growing transportation infrastructure challenges, Proposition 7 helps address funding shortfalls. The amendment dedicates sales tax revenues to the State Highway Fund. Association members are urged to vote YES on these three important propositions, as well as telling those you know to do the same.

The Association remains on the watch for federal regulation that can impact our members and the small business community. As previously reported to members by the Dallas Builders Association, on May 4, 2015, the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration issued the final rule on Confined Spaces in Construction. While the rule went into effect on Aug. 3, OSHA decided that citations would not be issued until Oct. 2 if an employer was making a good-faith effort to fulfill training requirements and other compliance requirements.

Now that we have passed Oct. 2, builders, subcontractors and even developers need to be aware of the new requirements listed in what can be considered a confusing rule. More information, including NAHB's detailed fact sheet that breaks down the rule, can be found in the Oct. 30 blog post under the Advocacy tab on the Dallas BA website.

There has been positive movement in Congress as it relates to the process of energy code development. Legislation backed by the NAHB and Dallas BA that reforms the role of the Department of Energy (DOE) in the energy codes development process met approval on Aug. 30 in the House Energy and Commerce Committee.

The North American Energy Security and Infrastructure Act of 2015 included a provision that would do the following:

Improve affordability by requiring any DOE-supported code proposal to have a payback period of 10 years or less.

Ensure that all DOE code change proposals are made available to the public, including calculations on costs and savings.

Ensure product neutrality by prohibiting DOE from advocating on behalf of certain products and technologies.

Protect a state's right to adopt any code, standard or version deemed appropriate.

Dallas BA sent letters to our service area's congressional members on the committee urging their support for the bill. During our Bringing Housing Home legislative visits in 2014 and 2015, we stressed the need for this type of legislation.

As we move into the cooler months of fall, members should keep in mind that regulatory issues will continue to heat up.
