Member Participation Vital for Association Advocacy Efforts

Rally Day and HOMEPAC of Greater Dallas will be key in the coming year

Dallas Builders Association had a busy year on the government affairs front. From defeating a proposed stormwater deposit fee and working to lower the assessed rates of roadway impact fees, to obtaining a regionally recognized prescriptive trade-off related to air changes per hour that eases the impact of the 2015 International Energy Conservation Codes and working to get options for constructed developments facing mail delivery challenges posed by this area's implementation of the US Postal Service's centralized delivery requirement.

Just as the Association moves further through the process for municipal tree ordinances in Dallas and Denton Counties, more tree preservation and impact fee ordinance revisions are coming forward in Collin County.

Policy issues that demand advocacy from the Association come at the local, state and federal level. We have the benefit of partnering with the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) for all things federal. And with the State Legislature firing up what will be an interesting session in January, our strong relationship with the advocacy team at Texas Association of Builders (TAB) guarantees continued activity. This all brings the opportunity and need for member participation.

Rally Day 2017, the event that allows our members to not only have needed face time with state legislators, but also gives an up close view of the session in process, will be held on Feb. 22, 2017, in Austin. As members of the housing and development industry, it is important that we are all aware of any issues that would be detrimental to our industry, especially those issues we as a group have the ability to address before they become requirements or law. 2017 will be a year in which we need to pay particularly close attention to our industry issues. Rally Day 2017 will provide an opportunity for you to deliver to your legislators the message that housing is important to Texas.

As their constituent, your voice carries weight with these policy makers. Lawmakers aren't experts in home construction, so they need to hear from you. Your knowledge of your business and your insight on how regulation will impact it provides the real world view that the legislature should keep in mind. A personal visit to our area's state senators and representatives can make a difference. Rally Day is the perfect event for providing reinforcement to our representatives regarding important issues they will be addressing in the following few months.

As Rally Day 2017 gets closer on

the calendar, members will be provided updates on event logistics and how to participate, as well as information on key policy issues. The Dallas BA will provide buses to and from Austin for our members to attend Rally Day. Partnerships are available. Just as crucial is the ability of the Association to remain the influential voice of homebuilding with our local government leaders. Municipalities are the epicenter for the creation of many of the codes, zoning and fee ordinances that have significant cost impacts on homebuilding. In recent years we have witnessed the push to have cities weigh in on private labor and wage matters.

Spring of 2017 will see key city council seats open up for election. This includes the office of mayor in multiple cities. Dallas, Allen, Denton, Frisco, Flower Mound, McKinney and Prosper are just some of the cities where races can be expected. It is important that those elected to serve in area city halls understand the need for a regulatory environment that does not encumber homebuilding and other businesses. If the Association does not find a seat at the

table, our members will be on the menu.

In the effort to build a regulatory environment that is considerate of homebuilding, your participation in HOMEPAC of Greater Dallas is necessary and beneficial. Millennials present challenges, opportunities for NT Housing Market Dallas BA / Meyers Research November Housing Outlook Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington MSA

According to the latest study on consumer trends from Zillow, half of today's U.S. home buyers are under 36. In fact, 47 percent of the people currently buying new homes are first-time buyers, according to the report derived from an online survey.

By contrast, mail surveys from the National Association of REALTORS[®] indicate that first timers account for about 32 % of all buyers.

Dallas Builders Association member builders ranked millennials behind Generation X and baby boomers as their most common buyer. The contrasting studies may be related to the survey methodology, but the Zillow study provides optimism that millennials will soon enter the homebuying market.

Housing economists cite delayed household formation among millennials as one of the key factors in a slow housing recovery nationwide. According to the National Association of Home Builders, 65% of millennials aspire to live in a single-family home.

However, that age group has experienced the largest decline in homeownership rates since 2006. According to the most recent U.S. Census Bureau's Housing Vacancy Survey, which reported data from 2010 to 2016, only 34.1% of millennials own a home, down from 39% in the second quarter of 2010.

Meanwhile, the Dallas-Fort Worth area is experiencing record growth and is on track to add more than 100,000 jobs this year, causing price increases, especially for new homes.

The median closing price for a new detached home in the Dallas-Fort Worth

region increased 5.4% year-over-year to \$305,637 in August, compared to the median closing price for an existing detached home which is now \$217,360.

"Market demand, increasing local regulations, and an ongoing labor shortage are all reasons why the average new home is more than \$88,000 more expensive than the average existing home," said Dallas Builders Association Executive Officer, Phil Crone.

"Obviously, that kind of premium is going to make it difficult for most first-time homebuyers to step into the new home market. We need to ensure our market and our industry meets the needs of millennials as they hold the key to our region's continued prosperity."

Overall, Dallas-Fort Worth home prices are hitting record highs. Prices are about 40% more than what they were a few years ago, but, for now, are still competitive nationally to the point where companies and workers continue to flock to the area for its low cost of living. Corporate relocations from more expensive markets are bringing in thousands of new home buyers this year.

Millennials have overtaken the baby boomers in sheer numbers, but both groups remain substantial real estate consumers.

While the boomers are retiring at a rate of approximately 10,000 per day, America's population of persons aged 90 and older has almost tripled since 1980, and is expected to increase to more than 7.6 million over the next 40 years, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.

Older households and younger

households are competing for housing in many of the same places. To grow business and meet housing demand from millennial buyers, Jeff Meyers, president of Meyers Research, advises builders to produce more affordable housing.

New homes priced between \$240,000 and \$320,000 and existing homes priced between \$120,000 and \$180,000 experience the most closing activity in the Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington MSA over the past year.

Multifamily development is still strong, with evolving amenities. There are opportunities in housing options for both groups.

Single-family developers are catering to millennials as well. Speaking to Dallas BA members at the Dallas Builders Show on Oct. 13, Hillwood Residential President Fred Balda cited Union Park as an example.

The development, which offers new homes from the mid-\$250,000s to the \$400,000s, features a food truck park and many other family-oriented amenities. "The food trucks appeal to millennials and, quite frankly, all ages," said Balda. "It also gives us a good idea of what restaurants would fare well in the area before committing to a fixed brick and mortar location."

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
