ARC Awards Makes Call to Enter

Entries opened April 2 for the 2018 ARC Awards, which recognize excellence for associate, remodeler and custom builder members of the Dallas Builders Association.

This year's gala is being presented in partnership with Centricity and will be held Saturday, Aug. 18, at the Westin Galleria in Dallas.

Milgard Windows & Doors will host the cocktail party to kick off the event.

The deadline for entries is Friday, June 29. Judging will be held the week of July 9 with finalists announced the week of July 16.

ARC Awards partnerships range from \$500 for a Silver Partner to \$2,000 for a Platinum Partner.

The Dallas BA's second annual State of the Industry Summit on March 8 revealed that the end of the Dallas region's construction labor and affordability crisis is a long way off. A new estimate from Meyers Research that the construction labor shortage increased from 20,000 last year to 37,000 this year was the most staggering figure for attendees

"We estimated the demand for construction workers in the Metroplex by reviewing the dollar value of spending on new (commercial, residential and industrial) construction and multiplying that by the jobs estimated per dollar spent in the industry for the Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington MSA as determined by the US Bureau of Economic Analysis," said Meyers Research Senior Vice President Scott Davis.

"We compared this number of anticipated jobs versus actual construction employment numbers from the Texas Workforce Commission to determine the potential deficit of construction workers.'

"From surveying our members, I knew the situation wasn't getting any better, but I was shocked to see it was so much worse than previously thought," said Dallas BA Executive Officer Phil Crone. "This will only strengthen our resolve to empower the next generation of our industry through vocational training and to lobby Congress for a guest worker program that meets our industry's needs and provides certainty and security for our workforce. If we don't succeed, we will continue to lose the affordability advantage our region's economy has benefited from."

Speaking further to the loss of housing affordability, Meyers presented "The Century Club," a list of cities where the income required to afford a new home now exceeds \$100,000. The list included Frisco, Prosper, Irving, Richardson, Allen, McKinney, Mansfield and others. Due to lending requirements, \$100,000 of income can afford a home priced around \$360,000. The Spring Advocacy Roundup: **Election Season Never Ends**

With the onset of spring, the calendar is flourishing with opportunities for Association members to participate on our government relation efforts.

Unless you have not opened your mailbox or turned on your television or radio in recent months, you are aware of the slew of primary election races that. for some, wrapped up on March 6. (If you are not aware, I implore you to clear your mailbox free of the satchel load of mailers before your neighbors complain of street clutter.) A strong majority of Dallas BA preferred candidates in listed county, state and federal primary races will be moving on to the general election in November. But members should be aware that the 2018 primary election season is not over. Multiple races in the service area will be decided in a runoff election that will conclude on May 22, with early voting between May 14 and 18. The races include Texas House District 4 and the U.S. House races for Texas Congressional Districts 5 and 6.

Races for city council seats in multiple municipalities are heating up as well. Election Day for municipal races is May 5, with early voting scheduled April 23 through May 1. While not all cities have active races, members are encouraged to follow the elections that occur in areas they work in as well. It is a good opportunity to get to know those who may be the future decision makers on issues that impact home building and development. But don't let voter fatigue set in; the November general elections, and a new satchel load of mailers, will be here before you know it.

Addressing Shortages in Professional Trades and Trades Education

The Dallas Builders Association has increased efforts to raise awareness of professional trades career opportunities related to residential construction.

One driving force behind the effort is to ensure students preparing to enter the workforce, as well as those who are currently seeking or transitioning career fields, are aware of and can be trained for the great opportunities that exist in

the residential construction fields. Another pressing factor behind the ongoing effort is the shortage of skilled workers in the building industry. In July of 2017, NAHB published findings on a survey of single-family builders regarding labor and subcontractor shortages. Its Special Questions on Labor and Subcontractors' Availability showed a disturbing trend. Between 2012 and 2017, the percent of surveyed home builders citing a shortage in skilled workers, in the 9 trade areas that NAHB has historically tracked, grew from 21 percent in 2012 to 63 percent in June of 2017. The trend also revealed that the gap for subcontractors in those trade areas has been running higher since 2013.

A further consequence of this crisis is its negative economic impact. In the Dallas service area, builders have indicated that the shortage in skilled labor has added as much as 2 months to the completion of residential construction projects. That added timeline comes with a significant cost per home.

Another shortage has a direct impact on this issue, the shortage of Education and Information. Over the past 20+ years, many schools have phased out courses that were a staple for construction trades education. Many students are unaware of the strong wages and great opportunities that wait them in the professional trades, including the

David Lehde Director of Government Affairs opportunity to be their own boss. With

a significant percentage of high school graduates not attending or finishing college, this shortage leaves many students with the aptitude to succeed in professional trades on the sideline.

Dallas BA has made the encouragement of professional trades education in schools one of its priorities. Outreach to schools in the Dallas, Garland and Waxahachie school districts has provided the opportunity to engage the future, host construction site visits and introduce students to experienced contractors.

Efforts are also ongoing at other local HBAs across the state, the Texas Association of Builders and the National Association of Home Builders.

Congress can help by considering ways to incentivize and attract our nation's youth to professional trades programs. Better finding is needed for workforce training, whether it is apprenticeship or other types of earnand-learn programs. Congress has the opportunity currently to address the crisis through reauthorization bills on education. The U.S. House has passed the Career Technical Education (CTE) reauthorization bill (H.R. 2353), also cited as the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for 21st Century Act. Reauthorizing the Carl D. Perkins Act, it helps more Americans enter the workforce with skills necessary. With the legislative clock ticking, it is time for the Senate to move on this legislation.

exceeded the figure.

"These price increases certainly have a lot to do with market forces, but there are plenty of self-inflicted and avoidable factors in here as well," said Dallas BA President Alan Hoffmann of Hoffmann Homes. "Cost increases attributable to building materials, labor and a massive increase in local regulation are putting homeownership out of reach for many working families.'

The affordability gap between new homes and existing homes has reached its widest point since the early 1990s. Adjusted for inflation, an existing home today costs about as much as a new home did in 1990.

"There's a massive demand for homes in the \$250,000 to \$350,000 range that the existing market only has limited capacity to fill," said Crone. "Unfortunately, the cost factors we are grappling with prevent most builders from filling the void in close proximity to our area's employment centers."

Rising interest rates due to the strength of our nation's economy are an emerging affordability concern. Just a quarter percent increase in mortgage interest rates will price 15,209 Dallas households out of the opportunity for new homeownership according to Meyers.

J.P. Delmore, assistant vice president for government affairs with the National Association of Home Builders, also spoke at the Summit. Delmore made it clear that affordability concerns are not just confined to the Dallas area, stating that more than a third of builders nationwide cite the lack of labor as their No. 1 challenge. He helped lead NAHB's efforts to ensure that housing remained a priority in the recent tax reform legislation.

Delmore spoke about the twists and turns the legislation took and how relentless opposition from NAHB ensured that key housing tax incentives including the mortgage interest deduction and parity for pass through entities was restored in the final bill.

More than 300 industry professionals attended the Dallas BA's annual gathering. Despite all the challenges, each of the builders and developers on the discussion panel was optimistic about the opportunities 2018 had to offer and feel that optimism will persist as long as new jobs keep flowing into the region.
