Dallas BA launches Dallas BA's Industry **Investors for 2019** prestigious Certified L&S MICHANICAL **Star Builder program**

The Dallas BA Education Committee is proud to announce the redevelopment of a newly named local certification, Certified Star Builder. To achieve this prestigious certification, Dallas BA builder members must adhere to strict requirements and ethics training.

In an unlicensed state it can be difficult to set oneself apart from others; this certification was developed to assist BUILDER builders demonstrate their commitment to excellence to their clients. All CSB members will be approved

by the Dallas BA Education Committee. After completing the ethics training, applicants will be required to pass an exam with no less than a score of 70% along with signing the CSB code of ethics.

Certified Star Builders will have demonstrated their company's desire to go above and beyond. The requirement of the certification includes proof of general liability insurance,

Builders, earn CAPS designation in 3 days

On average, members who hold the Certified Aging-in-Place Specialist (CAPS) designation report higher company revenues than that of their competition who hold no designations. According to the NAHB builder member census, evaluated by NAHB Economics, CAPS designation holders saw in increase of \$110,838 in company revenue. By holding a CAPS designa-

tion members not only see increased profits but also gain credibility amongst consumers. By becoming CAPS designated you will become an expert in understanding the technical, business management and customer service skills essential to competing in the fastest-growing segment of the residential remodeling industry-home modifications for the aging-in-place market. Currently, there is a need for CAPS qualified contractors in our area. The Dallas/Ft. Worth MSA has a population of about 6.5 million, 14% of which are 65 years of age or older. Currently, there are only 64 CAPS designees to service 14% of this demographic or 910,000 people. The Dallas BA hopes to correct this issue by offering a three-day CAPS course on Aug. 12, 13 and 14. These courses will give an indepth, how-to education on the codes and standards, common remodeling expenditures and projects, product ideas, and resources needed to provide comprehensive and practical agingin-place solutions. Along with this participation in an OSHA safety plan, energy considerations and continuing education.

All CSBs must hold a Certified Graduate Builder, Graduate Master Builder, Certified Green Professional

or Certified Aging-in-Place Specialist certification from the National Association of Home Builders. The certification will require renewal each year to authenticate that the parameters of the certification are still being met.

As the year continues, the Dallas BA will add additional local certifications

for remodeler and associate members. The Education Committee anticipates the Certified Star Remodeler program will begin this year. Stay tuned for details.

Dallas BA takes industry concerns to Washington

Members and staff of the Dallas BA helped make the home building industry's voice heard on June 5 during meetings with our service area's Congressional delegation in Washington, D.C. Dallas BA joined other home builder associations from around the country to talk housing policy with members of Congress.

With affordability being one of the biggest challenges to making homes attainable, the Association spoke with members of Congress about the need for housing finance reform, workforce needs and trade policy.

Dallas BA urged the swift ratification of the United States-MexicoCanada-Trade Agreement, as well as asking that our congressional delegation urge the Administration to end tariffs on imports of softwood lumber, steel, aluminum and a wide variety of other goods used by the home building industry.

The discussions also included a request for Congress to pass a long-term reauthorization of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Shortly after home builders visited with Congress, it was announced that House leadership had reached an agreement on a 5-year reauthorization of the NFIP.

The congressional meetings were part of NAHB's legislative conference.

Association Government Relations Efforts See Successful Spring

at the Capitol.

It has been a successful spring for Association advocacy. Along with work being done at the local level, Dallas Builders Association government relations staff and members engaged on key pieces of legislation in coordination with Texas Association of Builders. And in a follow up to the successful Rally Day we had at the State Capitol in March, a June visit to Washington, D.C., put members front and center before Congress at a crucial time.

As mentioned last month, Governor Abbott has signed into law Dallas BA priority legislation HB 852 that works to prevent the flawed practice of basing the user fees on how expensive a home is as opposed to the appropriate manner of basing them on the cost to provide the service. HB 852 became effective upon the Governor's signature. Dallas BA Executive Officer Phil Crone and Director of Government Affairs David Lehde made multiple trips and calls to Austin in support of the bill. Association member Kevin Webb joined staff for testimony.

Two other key pieces of legislation have joined others in becoming law. On June 15, the Governor signed HB 1743, which reduces the burden of agriculture exemption roll-back taxes on builders and home buyers. The law becomes effective on Sept. 1, 2019, lowering the number of years that the agriculture rollback tax is due from five to three years and lowering the interest rate owed on those back taxes from 7 to 5 percent. The Legislative Budget Board forecasts that the bill would save nearly \$500-million in roll-back taxes paid by property owners over the next 10 years. In the battle to keep housing attainable, this bill helps. Dallas BA's Past President Frank Murphy took multiple trips to Austin to offer testimony in support of the bill.

On June 14 the Governor signed HB 2439, which protects consumer choice, allows a city to enact building codes with local amendments, but prohibits a city from using a building code or other local ordinance to mandate vendor driven and product specific mandates in construction, which results in the direct or indirect prohibition of other products that are approved by national codes and standards.

It is important to note that the bill exempts historic buildings, certain government funded housing and disaster recovery programs, and certain lighting to meet dark sky ordinances and protect military bases. The bill also does not apply to property owners' associations, as those types of architectural or other deed restrictions are adopted as a matter of contract between private parties – not mandated by the government.

The above bills were also part of the



hurricane season on the horizon and our region still dealing with previous storm issues, a long-term program is needed.

A prime example of the importance of member participation in advocacy, as well as the work NAHB can do with the power of its federation with state and local home builder associations, came just one day later when House Financial Services Committee Chairwoman Maxine Waters and Ranking Member Patrick McHenry announced they had reached an agreement on a five-year extension of the NFIP.

Back here in the Association's service area, runoff elections were completed on June 8. This wraps up the 2019 spring municipal elections. In the races where HOMEPAC engaged, 75% of preferred candidates won. This includes 12 of 13 targeted races in the City of Dallas. The preferred candidate for Dallas Mayor won. A strong majority of supported candidates were also successful in Collin and Denton counties.

The reality is, while unofficial, the campaigns for the 2020 state and municipal elections start now. To continue our advocacy successes, member investment in HOMEPAC of Greater Dallas is needed. The general political action committee supports candidates for office who understand the need for a regulatory environment that does not encumber home building and residential development. Please contact the Director of Government Affairs about participation.



It was on July 20, 1944, when the population of Dallas County was flirting with 400,000, that a group of home builders and mortgage bankers met on invitation of commercial and residential developer Hugh Prather, who would become the professional organization's first president.

Founding members banded together in efforts to secure fair representation in deregulation and for allocation of scarce materials following World War II, the victorious outcome of which was then foreseeable.
