Elections

A heated November election has resulted in some big wins, along with the need to now monitor multiple runoff races. And that will take us into the spring 2021 municipal elections, which are already firing up. Meanwhile, the usual regulatory activity remains a priority

Dallas Builders supported candidates performed well on Nov. 3. Of the 68 candidates listed in the Dallas Builders Voter Guide, 86 percent found victory. Two more candidates in hotly contested races are headed to runoffs.

Locally, a strong list of municipal, county and state candidates supported by HOMEPAC of Greater Dallas made it through the very heated general election. Two of those, Mayoral candidate Gerard Hudspeth and Council Place 6 at Large candidate Jim Mann, are now headed to the Dec. 8 runoff election in Denton

A strong majority of the Dallas BA and Texas Association of Builders favored state government candidates prevailed in our service area with 94 percent seeing election or re-election.

Dallas/Fort Worth area builders will continue to have their voices heard in the halls of Congress due to big wins by builder supported candidates. Senator John Cornyn will return and the region will again send builder friendly Texans to the U.S. House.

The Dallas area House delegation will include two new members: longtime Dallas BA friend Pat Fallon and Beth Van Duyne, who has recognized the importance of our Associatio weighing in on housing issues.

Fallon previously served in the Texas Senate and Van Duyne is former Regional Administrator to th U.S. Department of Housing and Urba Development.

In addition to the multiple munic pal runoff races that will be held on De 8, eyes will also be on the special rund election for Texas Senate District 3 Builder-supported Drew Springer, with currently serves as a State Represent tive, qualified for that runoff election where early voting begins on Dec. with the final opportunity to vote bei Dec. 19

With the pandemic having move 2020's municipal elections onto the November ballot, it will be a short turn around into the 2021 spring municipal elections. There will be key city council races on the ballot, including two races

There has been no shortage of in the City of Denton and all council member seats in the City of Dallas.

Municipal Regulatory Issues

On the regulatory front, the City of Fate recently approved changes to its impact fees. Final approval was given in November. As previously reported by the Dallas BA, Fate recently updated their roadway, water and wastewater impact fees.

After hearing from the Association's staff and membership regarding our concerns about the impacts on housing attainability, Fate City Council instructed city staff to go with an option that would lessen the increase of fees assessed per home.

Upon final vote, the roadway impact fee was updated at an amount roughly \$2,000 less than what was in the city's original update.

As development increases around the Dallas/Fort Worth region, some cities have taken approaches that can seriously encumber the residential development sector's mission to provide needed homes.

In November, the Town of Argyle moved forward with a questionable moratorium to restrict all future new development applications such as zoning changes, SUPs, site plans, and plats. But it will not restrict submission of permits for properties or buildings that have already received plat and/or site plan approvals, unless changes such as zoning are requested. Dallas BA will continue to monitor this issue.

Obviously, the world of government and politics does not take many breaks. This is why a core mission of the Dallas Builders Association is advocacy.
