"The emotions shared by Corpsman Velez and Spencer during the dedication exemplified the journey they've been on together and were shared by everyone in attendance who contributed to this happy chapter of their lives," he stated. Following the dedication and ribbon-cutting ceremonies, Velez received the keys to her new home.

The veteran has been recognized with a Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, Presidential Unity Citation, National Defense Service Medal, and Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, among other accolades.

The dedication was an exciting milestone for Operation Finally Home, marking the 200th home the nonprofit has provided for America's heroes, through the generosity of donors and the help of partners. To celebrate, a neighborhood welcome home party for key supporters, recipients and the Irving community followed the Velez Dedication Ceremony. U.S. Navy Corpsman Luisa Velez and her son Spencer do the honors during July 26 dedication ceremonies at their new custom-built mortgagefree home in Irving. This marks the eighth Operation Finally Home project for the Dallas BA and the 200th for Operation Finally Home, an organization that teams up with local builder associations to provide homes to combat-wounded veterans.

"It is an honor to welcome U.S. Navy Hospital Corpsman Third Class Luisa Velez and her family to their new home," said OPFH President Rusty Carroll. "Every home we build for a veteran, first responder or their family is an honor and a blessing, but as our 200th build, this project holds special significance. We are committed to the work of giving America's heroes a place to come home to long into the future."

Velez was initially surprised with the news that she would be receiving a mortgage-free, custom-built home last November. She and her son Spencer thought they were meeting with representatives from Operation Finally Home and Winston Custom Homes as part of a preliminary interview process. During a drive around the neighborhood, the Patriot Guard Riders intercepted the family and escorted them to the homesite for a special groundbreaking ceremony.

Permit Times, Codes and Educating the Decision Makers

After a successful time in Washington, D.C., earlier this summer, advocating to members of Congress on American housing needs, Dallas BA continued its regulatory focus here at home.

After meeting with the new City of Dallas Chief Building Official earlier this year, a team from Dallas BA met again with city leadership in late July to both hear the plan the CBO has to get efficiency back into the permitting process, and to ensure city leadership has a firm understanding of the negative impacts that are coming from permit delays.

The team from Dallas BA detailed how builders are still facing delays upwards of seven months. They explained how houses that were previously constructed in acceptable time frames were facing schedules outwards to a year.

At a time when material costs are already a nightmare, the additional carrying costs from permit delays are adding greatly to the cost to build a home. Supply chain issues are one thing, but when a delay comes right in the start of the process, it makes it that much worse. Ultimately, it impacts the consumer.

Dallas BA expressed the need to be proactive on stuck projects, including developing a process to address those projects that have been in the queue for 12 weeks or more, and figure out why they are delayed. In addition, the Association stresses the importance of focusing on ways to simplify the process and make it consistent.

The CBO expressed his agreement with the need to alleviate the hurdles facing builders, including finding a more customized process for how projects of different scopes are handled for review.

With the update to the city's permitting platform, the Development Services Department hosted two virtual demonstrations of ProjectDox 9.2, on July 12 and 13, to provide the public with an introduction to the new software. The experience provided a step-by-step walk-through from the applicant's point of view.

The webinars were helpful, as 95 stakeholders participated to get a first look at the new enhancements. Additional training dates are scheduled for Aug. 13, 20, 27 and Sept. 10. These classes will be held in-person. Development Services has sent out the notice for registration.

Builders in Dallas should also be aware of the scheduled four-day permitting system outage that is scheduled to begin on Thursday, Aug. 4. The time is needed as Development Services transitions the platform from city servers to the new ProjectDox 9.2 cloud version.

The system will be back online Monday, Aug. 8. An update from the city indicates that DEV staff are prepared to receive and review paper submissions during that time.

Dallas BA is monitoring cities in the region as departments consider updating their building codes to adopt the 2021 I-codes, including the International Residential Code, the International Energy Conservation Code, and others.

The cities of Frisco and Celina have already informed that they are in the drafting process and Dallas BA will offer review.

Both hope to have their adoption completed by fall. Like other cities, Celina and Frisco plan to take advantage of the benefit of including the regional amendment recommendations that are produced by the North Central Texas Council of Governments Regional Codes Coordinating Committee (RCCC).

Dallas BA is a voting member of the RCCC and, along with other stakeholders, worked to provide amendments that help the codes focus on health and safety, while working to avoid needless requirements and cost increases.

The cities of Plano and Denton recently completed their process and made use of the RCCC recommendations as well.

Much like we do at the local level, Dallas BA continues to take advantage of opportunities to help educate federal decision makers on the benefits of letting builders do what they do; drive better building science through market choices.

This was the case when Dallas BA Past President Matt Mitchell gave a presentation on structurally insulated panel construction at an annual energy David Lehde Director of Government Affairs



efficiency summit held by U.S. Congressman Michael C. Burgess, M.D. (TX-26) on July 16.

Over the years, many members of Dallas BA have presented at the summit and educated both decision makers, and the public who elects them, about energy efficiency in modern home construction.

The ability to have a seat at the table and help educate elected officials about how regulation impacts the residential construction and development sector is a significant tool in the advocacy box for the Association.

With recent municipal elections and the upcoming November general and municipal elections, it is important for our industry to communicate with those who may be elected in November to write and vote on regulations that impact your bottom line. So, mark Aug. 31 on your calendar as a fun opportunity to help in that process.

The HOMEPAC Shootout will be presented by BGE on Wednesday, Aug. 31, at the famed Elm Fork Shooting Sports facility in Dallas.

Benefiting HOMEPAC of Greater Dallas, the event provides a fun opportunity to support Association advocacy and enjoy a morning in the outdoors. Participant entry is \$150 per shooter, which includes breakfast, lunch, and beverages. You can also register a team of 4 for \$600. Shooters must provide their own ammunition (20 or 12 gauge), as well as eye and ear protection.
