## **Professional Women in Building** participate in Collin College event

By Sheena Beaver Dallas BA **Operations** Officer Members of the Association's Professional Women in Building Council participated March 22 in the annual Collin College Women in Construction event, which encourages and connects emerging female industry professionals.

The event had a great turnout. Currently enrolled students primarily filled the seats with a few previously established women leaders who work in the industry. Student demographics vary at the college; some are just out of high school, while others are starting on a second career change.

Cheri Weinhagen, professor of construction management at Collin College, moderated the event, which hosted guest speakers such as Meredith Chapman of K.

Hovnanian Homes, who is vice chair of the Dallas BA's Professional Women in Building Council.

Following the inspiring speeches, a panel of women experts was held. Included were Dallas BA members Katie Youngblood, Highland Homes; Teresa Williams, KJ Custom Screens & Outdoor Living; and Tiffany Acree, StrucSure Home Warranty, who shared some of their struggles and how they overcame them in a male-dominated industry.

One of the biggest takeaways was that each speaker encouraged the students to find a mentor and join groups dedicated to the construction industry.

At the conclusion of the event, each student picked a numbered miniature hard

hat and was handed an envelope corresponding with their number.

The big reveal was the envelopes held scholarship amounts ranging from \$250 to \$1,000 for each student to use to further their education.

The Dallas BA's PWB Council has donated \$10,000 to Collin College for the last two years and plans to do it again next year.

## Association Advocacy Stretches from the Region to Capitol Hill

In the City of Dallas, the proposed ordinance that updates development and building fees was brought back to the City Council on March 27 for a final vote.

The city's original fee study proposed increases that would have added thousands of dollars to the cost of construction for both single-family and multifamily homes. The study even proposed an increase for one fee that was more than 2,500%.

The draft ordinance, which was brought before the city council on Dec. 13, actually saw many of those proposed fees reduced from the version that was presented in the fee study after City Council members heard from the Dallas BA and fellow stakeholders. Still, due to concerns regarding the assumptions made in the study, the possible impact on housing affordability, and the need to have more input from those stakeholders, the City Council postponed action on the item until their Jan. 24 meeting. After hearing more from Dallas BA, the council postponed their decision again until the March 27 City Council meeting.

This allowed city staff to make needed changes in ordinance language that was requested by Dallas BA. Builders and developers should review the updated fee schedule and plan accordingly.

In the City of Heath, Council members recently voted to approve amendments to the city's landscaping and irrigation ordinance. While most of the ordinance appears to restate what is already required by state statute and Texas Commission for Environmental Quality guidelines, Dallas BA has asked the Council for clarity regarding if the ordinance's

requirement for a permit application to install an irrigation system is intended to be enforced in the extraterritorial iurisdiction (ETJ) and whether it only applies to systems that are supplied by city-owned facilities.

Heath's ordinance also updates the approved tree planting list. As Heath continues to struggle with answers regarding water supply, Dallas BA will continue to monitor the city for any related ordinances that impact development.

In other parts of the region, Dallas BA continues to provide our members with opportunities to build connections with area decision makers.

Dallas BA's Volume Builders & Developers Committee hosted Denton County Judge Andy Eads on March 28. Judge Eads offered a timely update on the county's economic growth, major roadway plan and long-term expectations.

The residential construction sector received good news on the workforce front in March. An NAHB lead advocacy effort, which included the participation of Dallas BA members and government relations staff, resulted in the saving of the Job Corps program. Appropriations action in late summer 2023 had threatened to eliminate the needed \$1.76 billion in funding for the highly successful trades education program. And North Texas Job Corps, the Job Corps campus in McKinney, could have been affected.

Dallas BA members and staff visited with a member of the House Appropriations Committee to discuss the need for the funding to be reinserted into what is commonly known as the "Labor H" appropriations bill. NAHB's advocacy endured and House



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lawmakers agreed in March to approve Senate appropriations' move to maintain the Job Corps funding through the end of fiscal 2024.

Job Corps provides free career training and education for 16- through 24-year-olds. The program trains trades for 10 industries and countless careers, offering students an opportunity to work hard, grow, and begin a career or apprenticeship.

However, the carousel of policies affecting our industry never stops spinning. Recently, the White House announced controversial emissions regulations that will impact the cost and availability of certain vehicles. This comes at a time when families continue to deal with inflation. And it can impact housing affordability as well. There is a constant push by some to have the total cost of electric vehicles hidden by requiring new homes to be constructed with EV charging equipment or infrastructure. It should not be the responsibility of workingclass families to pay for aftermarket equipment for a vehicle that many plan not to purchase, nor can afford.

Dallas BA has already defeated such requirements in the region. But you can expect more to be proposed. When the government oversteps its boundaries to pick marketplace winners and losers, more is lost.

Obviously, advocacy to our federal policy makers is important. And Dallas BA will engage them again this year in our meetings with our service area's Congressional delegation as part of NAHB's National Legislation Conference in Washington, D.C., on June 12. The meetings occur during the week of NAHB's Spring Leadership meetings.

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## Dallas Division will feature program on DFW Airport April 4
